Tradition Twelve

Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our Traditions, ever reminding us to place principles before personalities.

This tradition means that AA members should maintain their anonymity when speaking to the public or to the media. They should not identify themselves as AA members in press releases, interviews, or articles. This is to protect the privacy of individual members and to focus on the message of AA, rather than on the people who carry it.

There are several reasons why anonymity is important to AA. First, it allows members to feel safe and comfortable sharing their experiences in meetings. If they knew that their identity might be revealed, they might be less likely to speak openly about their struggles. Second, anonymity helps to keep the focus on the principles of AA, rather than on the personalities of its members. This is important because AA is not a cult of personality; it is a fellowship of people who are united by their common goal of recovery from alcoholism.

Anonymity also has a spiritual significance for AA members. It reminds them to put the needs of the group before their own individual needs. It also helps them to focus on their own personal growth and development, rather than on seeking fame or recognition.

Of course, there are some exceptions to the tradition of anonymity. For example, AA members are free to identify themselves as such to other AA members, to healthcare professionals, or to employers. However, they should always be mindful of the importance of protecting their own privacy and the privacy of other AA members.

By following Tradition 12, AA members can help to protect the privacy of the fellowship and focus on the message of AA, which is that recovery from alcoholism is possible.
